When did you last take your children to the optician? Free NHS sight tests are available at opticians for children under 16 and for young people under 19 in full-time education.


Eye checks are important as children may not realise they have a vision problem so, without routine tests, there's a risk a problem may not be spotted. This may affect their development and education.
