- 7. What do you do when others disagree with you?


Mrs Irons was extremely impressed with the behaviour of the whole school and said that it was the best behaviour she had seen so far on her school visits—well done everyone!

All Saints Day & All Souls Day


The school celebrated All Saints Day Mass together this morning to remember all those who have lived their lives really well and have died and gone to Heaven.

'ALL SAINTS' (Friday) is followed by 'ALL SOULS', when we pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory, who are undergoing purification before their one-by-one entry into Heaven.

These 2 days are the greatest CONSECUTIVE pair of days in the Church's Calendar or year. They form 2 of the 3 parts of the Communion of Saints which is the full Church. Souls in Heaven are the "CHURCH TRIUMPHANT"; souls in Purgatory are the "CHURCH SUFFERING"; we, and all believers in Jesus, are the "CHURCH MILITANT", so called because we are fighting the good fight of the Faith. There is such a close connection between these 3 categories.
